

## **OTHER PROGRAMMES:**

During the year the following programmes have also taken place:

> Ø The training in Pastoral Counselling skills which has largely focused on priests and religious for the past six years has now opened up for lay persons. On October 27, 2012, seven lay persons and one deacon graduated from this institute as trained pastoral

counselors and were awarded certificates by GSI.

- Ø Five lay persons completed their training as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.
- Ø 17 priests were trained in May in the art of spiritual direction from Abuja, Maiduguri and Idah dioceses.
- Ø Seminars for Lectors and Church Wardens were also held.
- Ø Directed retreats are ongoing for priests, religious and laity.
